THE GROUPS IN REVIEW - 1973

SPORTING GROUP

by HELEN LANGFORD

1973 was a vintage year for breeders and owners of sporting dogs. Entries were up, overall quality was improved and some of the lesser known breeds started a comeback. We saw more Chesapeake Bay Retrievers, Welsh Springer Spaniels and Flat Coated Retrievers shown. The Irish Water Spaniel and the Pointer are still taking a sabbatical. These two old breeds are sadly missed. Clumber Spaniels have been shown in the west and there is general interest right across the U.S. so, hopefully, we will see more of this attractive breed in competition in Canada before long.

There were many imports among the sporting breeds and considerably more interest has been taken by breeders to make real strides towards breeding top quality show dogs with emphasis on type. Following is a general review of some of the most frequently seen breeds as they impressed me during the past show year.

POINTERS—the pointer is one of the most graceful yet powerful dogs in our sporting group and I would like to see more interest in this breed in Canada. Seldom do we see more than a single entry. German Short-haired Pointers are present in small numbers at most shows. Quality improves every year and from young stock seen, we will have more good dogs in '74.

RETRIEVERS—the golden is gaining in popularity and the quality is very good. However, more care might be paid to true type and size control. Large numbers are being shown and are winning top placements at many of our shows. It is rewarding to note that in spite of the rise in this breed's popularity, excellent temperament still prevails.

Labradors were well represented and again quality is good. Many new breeders have joined the ranks and considerable interest has been shown in this breed during the past year. Again we have had top winners across the country and Canadian dogs have competed outside of Canada very successfully.

SETTERS—the English Setter has been well represented and quality has been excellent. Our Canadian dogs have done well south of the border as well as winning top placings in Canada. Many young dogs completed their championships in 1973 and we should look forward to seeing some fine specimens in breed competition this year. The Gordons—where are they? Occasionally a beautiful representative of this breed appears in the ring, does nice winning and that's the last we ever see of him. It seems too bad. The Irish Setter has had a wonderful year right across the country. Numbers of entries have more than doubled, the overall quality is excellent and the competition is very keen. The "redcoat" has had top billing in numbers in 1973.

SPANIELS—The American Cocker is starting to climb again. For some years the entries have been disappointing. In the '50s and '60s the American Cocker was the mainstay of the Sporting Group. Then entries took a downward turn and it is only during the past year or so that we have seen an increase. There have been some very good ones shown and the promise of the puppy classes is that we will see more good ones in the future. The English Cocker is

holding its own by entry and quality, particularly in the west. The English Springer is always a contender to be reckoned with. Quality has been excellent across Canada and major wins have been awarded to this breed at nearly every major show. Type has stood out in Springers. This is important because the breed excels in elegance and refinement.

VIZSLAS AND WEIMARANERS—recently these two breeds have not had the popularity one might expect. For a few years there seemed to be great interest but suddenly it seems to have dropped off. Hopefully we will see a revival and greater numbers of these two sleek sporting breeds will be represented at future shows.

Congratulations to all the winners of "top dog" placements. You have done very well, the top from the east coast—runner-up from the west and numbers three and four from Ontario. For all the breeders and owners of sporting dogs from coast to coast 1973 was certainly a vintage year.

HOUND GROUP

In scanning through my *Dogs In Canada* back about a decade it appears that the year 1973 was indeed the year of the "Hound", for I would think that when worked out on an average our hounds took more Best in Shows than breeds from any of the other five groups. Total numbers in the Hound Groups have almost tripled in the past ten years, but let's be serious, do we have the quality as well as quantity?

Heading the Hound Group this year we have Beagle, Ch. (Can. & Am.) Wagon Wheels Wisecrack. This dog, although a very slow starter, seemed to blossom forth during the past two years and gave his all. Perhaps this is a typical example of "don't rush your dog, give him time to mature". "Crackers," as he is called by his owners, came up the 1972 list from seventh place to the top of the list for 1973.

In second place on the winning slate for 1973 and placing fourth in 1972, was Whippet Ch. (Can. & Am.) Dondelayo Buccaneer. I think one outstanding thing about this dog is the number of handsome get he is leaving around the country, which of course makes this whole business of showing and breeding worthwhile.

In third spot, a newcomer, and of course I am pleased to see him within the ranks of the Top Ten, since he is bred and owned by me, is Standard Smooth Dachshund, Ch. Vondixoner Stardachs Johann. "JoJo" has now captured the title of top winning Standard Smooth of all time in Canada, defeating his littermate Ch. (Can. & Am.) Vondixoner Stardachs Jacob.

In fourth position we find Afghan Hound Ch. Amberhall Aquarius and I would think that this is a rather well earned reward since the number of Afghans being shown generally total one-third to one-half of the group and of course has more difficulty through competition of reaching breed level, let alone win a group.

Fifth in line for honours we find Whippet Ch. Alery Witch's Dance. This classy bitch captured three Best in Shows to the great pride of her owners Terry Taft and Alan Pepper who have worked so hard to keep this breed in line, so their first series of Best in Show was well deserved.

In sixth position we find the grand old man of the Afghans Ch. (Can. & Am.) Rujha's Mohammed of Kyberkhan. Although nearing ten years of age this dog still has a lot to give and is a credit to his handler Bill Green.

We find our old friend in the Borzoi, Ch. (Can. & Am.) Sirhan Porchai, down from first spot in 1972 to seventh in 1973. This of course is due to the fact that he was only shown the early part of the year and even at that captured a few Best in Shows.

Eighth in line we again find a Whippet, Ch. (Can. & Am. & Bda.) Night Talk of Wood Smoke, who represents the east coast to the great pride of her owners I am sure.

I am delighted to find a Saluki among the top ten, for in ninth place Ch. (Can. & Am.) Urray Cheheli has shown us that this breed will not be forgotten.

Perhaps the only dog among the top winning ten this year that did not win a Best in Show was Afghan Hound Ch. Rokeish Sorocco, indicating that he must have done a great deal of winning within the groups. I am sure that both his breeder and his owners are very proud as there were several other Afghan Hounds who won Best in Shows who did not quite make it to the top ten.

I have been asked to comment briefly on how I feel as a judge who had judged most of the hound breeds from coast to coast in recent years and as to my feelings on the quality of the various breeds. Most breeds I am pleased to say are holding their own well, although some breeds, such as the Scottish Deerhound and Rhodesian Ridgeback, we see far too little of even though I do know in some cases breeders of these two breeds have been trying their best to make something of the breed.

Perhaps the two hound breeds that concern me greatly are the Afghan and the Basset. I am certain that any serious breeder and exhibitor of these two breeds and the sincere hound exhibitor will readily agree. Although increasing in numbers the Afghan Hound is quickly becoming one of the most difficult breeds to judge. Like the Cockers in the 40's and 50's and the Poodles in the 50's and 60's some breeders found the way to make a "quick buck" and bred one dog to another without much thought of consequence. Little wonder that we find today the same Cocker and Poodle exhibitors doing most of the winning but if you will check carefully you will find that it is these exhibitors who have stuck with the breed, bred-out, bred-in, sold non-breeding dogs and have never been afraid to spend a dollar where they had to when improvement was needed.

Ten years ago we would find perhaps three or four Afghans at a show here in central Canada, all owned by Mary Matchett, one of the pioneers of the breed in Canada. If Mary were alive today she would bury her head in her hands at some of the specimens that are showing up in the ring. Judging Afghans has become a difficult task for any judge as it is not uncommon to find say in an open class of six, that all six are entirely different types. Then the work begins to sort out which is the proper type and unfortunately more often than not when you do find the proper type in structure one cannot get their hands on the dog properly due to temperament problems.

I would think that perhaps the most deteriorating part of the Afghan is the front end, for more and more I am finding straight shoulders, steep shoulders, fiddle

fronts, pinched-in chests and weak briskets and of course any of these will not allow the Afghan to have the desired reach. The structure of a dog is like that of a car, when one end is off sooner or later due to stress the other end will be off. Only one in 25 Afghans have the desired level bite and more than half that number have weak jaws and I am sure would have no more punishing effect on wild game than a rap over the knuckles with a pencil. For those Afghan breeders who have been trying hard for the past few years it has been showing up, for others of you just starting, be careful!

I earlier mentioned the Basset Hound having problems and indeed it has for the more I judge this breed the more I am finding unsound legs and feet, not all mind you, for you do find reasonable correctness in certain strains but I feel that all judges must rally together and stick with what the Basset Standard tells us, "unsound legs and feet must not be awarded a first prize". To make excuses that your dog makes up in head what he lacks in feet and body is not enough. Your dogs are hunters, they need good legs and feet.

Now that I have said my little piece I would like to take this opportunity to welcome all the Finnish Spitz fanciers to the Hound Group and wish you all good wins in 1974. I will be looking forward to the first time I will judge one of these dogs. I promise you I have studied the Standard well.

How many of you remember some of those who contributed well to the hound breeds whom we seldom see at the shows or who have passed on. Mary Matchett and Greta Phillips (Afghans), Pat Fisher, Joy Ostradol, Lilly Turner (Dachshunds), Frank Lawrence and Phil Jacobi (Beagles), Fred and Betty Carter (Bassets) who no longer exhibit the Westacres strain. We cannot afford to forget these people for they all deserve credit for their efforts.

Let's do all we can to promote our hounds to perfection—see you at ringside!

WORKING GROUP

It is very rewarding, in looking over the results of last year's top dog awards, to find that our "working dogs" took six placings in the "Top Ten—All Breeds" listing. To the "working dog" fancier this must indeed prove a point. Our "working dogs" are showing more quality in the main and producing that quality. Some breeds, I am sorry to say, seem to be producing more quantity than quality. A situation which I hope will level off in 1974.

Heading the list is the St. Bernard, Ch. Ambassadeur—Top Dog—all breeds. This dog is a credit to his breed, an extremely fine dog with a record to be proud of.

Next on the list, number three, all breeds, is the Old English Sheepdog, Ch. (Can. & Am.) Sir Lancelot of Barvan. I am glad to see that this wonderful breed is not being overpopulated, that the breeders are being careful and conscientious in their breeding programs. This is quite evident in the show ring.

In fourth place, all breeds, is the Doberman Pinscher, Ch. Schaufelein's Vintage Year, a truly great dog bred with quality. This breed has always been at the top in quality and it is hoped that the trend will continue and that newcomers to the breed will be as careful and as conscientious as our long-time Doberman breeders

have been.

Seventh place went to the Boxer, Ch. (Can. & Am.) Scher Khosh Meshack. Like his great "Shadrack" he is passing on quality as can be seen in the show ring at nearly every show across Canada. It is my hope that the Boxer will always rate a place among the "top ten—all breeds". We have a few not so common breeders of the lovely Boxer, I hoped that they will learn by their errors and, at least, try to improve rather than degrade.

In ninth place is the Bouvier des Flandres, Ch. (Can. & Am.) Blandford's Basko. This breed is holding its own in the Working Group. We would like to see a few more of them shown. Nevertheless, the quality is there. We have some fine Bouvier breeders, are doing a great job for their breed and it is my opinion that they will continue to do so.

In tenth place is the West Highland Corgi, Ch. Tiverton Talk of the Town. A great little dog with spirit and stamina and a great deal going for her. She can keep right up with the big ones. She is a pleasure to watch and would be lovely to own.

A number of other breeds are moving up in entries and should make it to the "Top Ten" before long. Meantime, with six out of the ten placings going to Working dogs this year, breeders have a lot to be proud of—Quality Will Show.

TERRIER GROUP

Although the detail of terrier breed achievement in 1973 shows quite a change, the total picture is much the same, and very satisfactory. The percentage of terriers in any show fluctuated considerably but 10% of the total entry is probably still a fair average, and terrier BIS wins for the year ran again at 20%, although terrier puppy wins dropped a little to 15% of the total.

Of 52 Best in Show awards claimed by 22 terriers representing 11 breeds, out of the overall total of 256, a spectacular record must have been set with no less than 25 of these going to the Kerry Blue, Ch. Kel-Tara's Star Jubilee. For the rest, the Lhasa Apso, Am. Ch. Orlano's Be Sparky of Al-Mar claimed three, the Lhasa Apso Ch. Se-Mar of Abbotsford, the Wire-haired Fox Terrier Ch. Runway Just Right, the Dandie Dinmont Ch. (Can. & Am.) Graymont's Geordie Macbaggpipe (remember his outstanding performance as a puppy?), and the Lakeland Ch. Ragatan Rebel of Sunlock. I scored two each, the balance of one each going to three Lhasa Apsos, three Westies, two Scottish terriers, two Bull Terriers, one Wire-haired Fox Terrier, one Dandie, one Welsh, one Kerry Blue, one Cairn and one Miniature Schnauzer.

The group winning picture was also dominated by the Kerry Blues, since of the total 261 Terrier Groups, 13 Keries claimed 44 of these going to Ch. Kel-Tara's Star Jubilee and six to Ch. Bluestone's Saint N Sinner. Fifteen Lhasas took 46 Groups, with Am. Ch. Orlano's Be Sparky of Al-Mar and Ch. Karabellia Gem-Pa Chi Se-Po each taking eight, 15 Westies took 35 groups with Ch. (Eng. & Can.) Lymelands Special Edition of Lindenholme accounting for seven, nine Wire-haired Fox Terriers took 10 groups, eight Scottish Terriers took 16 groups, two Bull Terriers between them claimed 14 groups.

eight going to the spectacular Ch. Sackville Rowdy Man, of whom more presently, and the other six to Ch. Paupens Mr. Wiggins. Cairns and Miniature Schnauzers each claimed 13 groups, two Dandies carried nine groups, including six by "Geordie Macbagpipe", two Lakelands claimed eight including seven wins by Ch. Ragatan Rebel of Sunlock, seven Bedlingtons totalled eight groups, four Welsh and four Airedales totalled seven respectively, one Skye claimed two, and a Norwich and a Smooth Fox Terrier took one each.

Of the 98 Terrier Group winners, it is interesting to note that 48 were Canadian-breds.

For Best Canadian-bred Puppy in Show competition, terriers held their own fairly well, with 22 dogs from nine breeds taking 38 awards. Outstanding of these was the Bull Terrier, Ch. Sackville Rowdy Man, who accounted for nine Best Puppy in Show and 27 Best Puppy in Group wins, also taking four Group 1sts from the Puppy Class. Westies also accounted for ten Best Puppy wins, including Ch. Roseneath Candy Man with three Best Puppy in Show and eight Best Puppy in Group, Ch. Cromarty Annie Laurie with two Best Puppy in Show and seven Best Puppy in Group, and Ch. Lochheather Duchess of Dreamland with one Best Puppy in Show and eight Best Puppy in Group. Outstanding also were the Smooth Fox Terrier, Logans

and a Group 1st, and the Miniature Schnauzers, Ch. Killocks Theodosius, with eight Best Puppy in Group, one Best Puppy in Show and a group win, and Tanyetta's Tub Thumper with three Best Puppy in Show and seven Best Puppy in Group. Leading Wire-haired Fox Terriers were Nesika's Tickle My Fancy with nine Best Group Puppy and one Best Puppy in Show, and Nesika's Pokey Dot Kid with eleven Best Group Puppy and one Best Puppy in Show.

The Terrier specialties were well supported as usual. The All Terrier Club of Alberta show, held in Calgary, with 121 dogs representing 18 breeds, was won by the Wire Fox Terrier Ch. (Can. & Am.) Tava Bob; the Red River Terrier Association show, held in Winnipeg, with 70 dogs representing 15 breeds, was won by the Kerry Blue, Ch. Bluestone's Saint N Sinner; the Terrier Breeders Association of Canada show, held in Toronto, with 153 dogs representing 19 breeds, was won by the Welsh Terrier, Ch. (Can. & Am.) Wil-Wag's Singapore Sling; the B. C. All Terrier Club show, held in Vancouver, with 115 dogs representing 17 breeds, was won by the Kerry Blue, Ch. Kel-Tara's Star Jubilee; and the Rideau Terrier Club show, held at Kars, near Ottawa, with 60 dogs representing 15 breeds, was won by the Westie, Ch. (Can. & Am.) Pinmoney Puck.

Only five specialty shows were held during the year: that of the National West Highland White Terrier Club, held at the Sportsmen's Show, with 11 benched, was won by Ch. (Can. & Eng.) Lyme-hills Special Edition of Linden-hall; that of the Bull Terrier Club

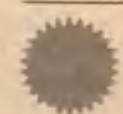
Ont., with 29 benched, was won by Highland's Bashful Dwarf; that of the Canadian West Highland White Terrier Club, held in Toronto, with 33 benched, was won by Ch. (Can. & Am.) Rose-neath Fair Charmer; that of the Airedale Terrier Club of Canada, held at Barrie, Ont., with 30 benched, was won by Ch. Tyan-daga Man O' War; that of the Staffordshire Bull Terrier Club of Canada, held in Ottawa, with ten benched, was won by Ch. Rossie Hussy of Terreo.

In obedience trials the only terrier breeds not represented last year were Borders, Dandies, Lakelands, Sealyhams and Skyes. Miniature Schnauzers topped the list again with 61 CD legs completed, 27 CDX legs and five Utility legs. Airedales came next with 34 CD legs and 14 CDX legs. Although no Welsh completed CD legs, they accounted for ten CDX and six Utility legs, and Highest Score in Trial was claimed by four Miniature Schnauzers, three Wire-haired Fox Terriers, a Cairn, a Smooth Fox Terrier, a Welsh and an Airedale.

There was a considerable increase in the numbers of Irish and Norwich Terriers shown during the year across the country, also several Staffordshire Terriers in the Western shows; still very few Borders and even fewer Manchesters. The Yukon terrier entry jumped last year to an encouraging 17 with six breeds represented.

Since breeders are concerned with placing pets as companions, quite apart from any show activity, one of our chief concerns must still be the threat to breed improvement posed by the mass

Canadian puppy mills. It behooves us all to keep a strict watch on where our bitches are placed and how our stud dogs are used. The terrier is an ideal companion and it is up to us to maintain him in quality.

I am most pleased this year to see the top toy Maltese, Ch. (Can. & Am.) Su-Le-Martin, was Canadian-owned and handled to the top spot and this also applies to the number two dog, a Yorkie, Ch. (Can. & Am.) Todwill's Fearless Fosdick. Numbers three, four, five, six the Peke Ch. (Can. & Bda.) YoucomSee Sammy; the Pom, Ch. (Can., Am., Mex. & Bda.) Int. FCI Graylyn's Tinemite Red Robin; the Toy Poodle, Ch. (Can., Am., Mex. and Bda., FCI) Ardynas Gay Gossip; and the Maltese, Ch. (Can. & Am.) Mike Mar's My Twilight Dream, respectively, were Canadian owned. Number seven and eight are American-owned: Ch. Pam-pers All Gusto of Arundel and Ch. (Am. & Bda.) Harmo Quick as a Wink. The ninth and tenth dogs, the Maltese, Ch. Revlo's Bangladesh and the Short Coat Chihuahua, Ch. (Can. & Am.) Hilaire's Pata-Cherie, were Canadian-owned.

Only two dogs this year were owned out of the country. I think this proves my contention that Canadian-owned and bred dogs are on a par, if not better, than

shows these days. I might also say that this does not only apply to heavily populated areas such as Ontario and Quebec. In my travels around the country, I have watched with pride our own dogs competing in top competitions from the Maritimes to British Columbia and have not found wanting in any way. The Canadian breeder has come a long way in the last few years. There was a time when they would not enter their dogs where large numbers of foreign dogs were entered because they did not feel they had a chance —those times are gone forever. Our top ten in toys proves that do not think most of these type awards are open to foreign dogs other countries. But I do believe it's a good thing here, if we prove to ourselves just what we are accomplishing.

The one thing I find lamentable and laughable at the same time is the fact that a dog can be disqualified one day and then go on to win Best in Show another day. In the United States, if a dog is disqualified it may not be shown again until it has been officially resubmitted by a committee set up for the shows and trials division of AKC, arranged in a local area to test the home of the exhibitor. The dog measures in, the dog of \$25.00 is returned to the owner.

When exhibitors are subjected to these strict rules in their country, our charade must be laughable to them and an obvious ridicule. The strange thing is the apparent lack of interest shown by the small number of letters received by the Dog Council on this particular matter.
