#### **2. Grad hosted speaker** – Lindsay

- a. Felix has committed to contribute \$1500.
- b. Nancy Baron is available (for a one-day visit only, e.g. a few hours for one-on-ones, lunch, talk, Club Ilia). Therefore, she wouldn't be present at the Olympiad on a separate day as a judge (which means we can be more flexible with the Olympiad date). She is also flexible on her speaker fee. We asked her to reduce it to \$1000. In order for her to have that approved, we need to officially invite her.

c. This year's grad hosted speaker event will cost more than last year's only due to us having to pay for her flights (from/to Santa Barbara). Also, we don't need to pay for a hotel for her (she can make other arrangements). The event will cost the BISC Grad Caucus \$1000 at the most (this is an over-estimate). Outside sources will pay for the rest. Plus if we sell alcohol we can recoup some losses (~\$200).

# 7. Departmental Meeting Updates – Lindsay for Jenny Linton

a. INSPIRE (Innovative Science Programs Integrating Research and Education) is a \$2 million program launched by the Dean of Science to develop department and faculty wide programming to improve five areas of teaching in Science, one of which includes graduate student courses. If you have suggestions, talk to Felix or your supervisor. They are thinking BIG and the more departments that are involved, the more likely they are to be considered and implemented. It is a one-time fund but it can be spread out over a couple of years for one or a few selected projects.
