- ii) Allison: As a follow up on this, would be excellent to survey each BISC PI to know how many grad students in the department, and how many in each lab, so we'll know how well we are reaching grad student audiences, and what gaps of people aren't being included.
- iii) Asim would like more legitimate cleaning supplies for events. Would get stored in locked cupboard between events.

- v) Colin Bailey: Had positive experience gaining financial support from SFU Library for Open Access Journal Publishing. Was very easy and efficient to deal with Library to get money to publish and open access article. Apply once your paper has been accepted.
- vi) Melissa: ongoing chair election, brought up at last DGSC meeting. Policies for voting a Chair in: There are two separate votes. First vote to settle on a candidate, second vote is a ratification vote. Second vote can only be faculty, but first vote can include others (eg could include Caucus, staff etc). Who should get to vote?!
  - Three years to plan it all. Caucus could email questions to candidates ahead of time. Committee to be formed with some students and faculty. Good use for grad caucus website as well!
- vii) Marie-Helen As a grad student for many years and R peer in the research commons, we don't learn proper coding and formatting, not trained to review each other's code, only trained to review each other's writing. Demand is there, so trying to build a community of students (and faculty) who need R coding help, improve coding language. One on one consultations and coding workshops. Help faculty build appropriate courses for undergrads and grads. No budget for it anywhere, looking for funding. Looking for unofficial support from Caucus as she sets out to see if there is funding for her. Marie will send out official proposal and set a time for a Q&A period. Caucus would write an official statement in support of Marie, after she sends out a proposal and holds a Q&A session.
