  - ii. GSS director elections are happening, so a few candidates talked to council about their election or re-election. Candidate profiles are on the GSS website.
  - iii. TSSU is requesting that councillors encourage their caucuses to respond to the RA surveys sent out. They were holding focus groups, which are perhaps now online? TSSU rep will likely expand on this.
  - iv. Studentcare, our healthcare service broker, is trying to raise fees more than inflation rates. The GSS has plans to oppose this, and any changes in fees would likely go to a referendum. We'll be chatting more about it at the April council meeting.
  - v. Graduate council voted to extend solidarity to Unist'ot'en and Gidimt'en opposition to RCMP and CGL on their territories as well as support their right to self-determination. The Exec Committee will be drafting a letter and sending it around to council.
  - vi. SFU Safe Walk Program is reviving and they are asking us to provide feedback on what graduate students need/want out of this program since they are more likely to be on campus after hours or on weekends. Let's have a brief chat about feed back or add your ideas to the chat.

  - v. Proposing grading criteria for directed studies/readings courses for undergraduate honors projects, specifically what is required to get an A+
  - vi. What to name second year physiology course? Still pending.
