Submissions

All submissions must be in English, clearly written and in sufficient detail to allow the referees to assess the merits of the work. Papers should be no longer than 5,000 words or 15 pages, double spaced, and should conform to APA standards. Submissions are welcome year-round. For publication in this year's edition, please submit papers no later than May 30, 2007, to cujcs-inquiries@sfu.ca. To ensure a blind review process, the author's name and contact information should not appear anywhere in the body of the paper. It should appear on a cover page only. Authors will be notified of acceptance by July 2007. Revisions will be made as suggested by the reviewers upon approval by original authors. CUJCS reserves the right to make minor edits for clarity.

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
