PREVIEW by Malcolm Page

Dinner with Friends, an American piece, is by Donald Margulies, who has risen rapidly to fame in the last 10 years: this is his second play to be performed in Vancouver (And PBS showed his Collected Stories in January). He is a middlebrow dramatist, more intelligent than writers of one-liner sit-coms, but not experimental either. Dinner with Friends turns on 2 couples, one announcing that they are splitting up, the other pair in fact much closer to separation, but denying it. I saw the play at Berkeley Rep. about a year ago and found it both comic and with human truths and insights, and will eagerly see it again. The Vancouver cast is very good, especially Susan Hogan, strong and forceful, and Camille Mitchell, whom I find the most watchable actress in the city (her Ariel in The Tempest at the Playhouse 20 years ago was unforgettable).
