

Research Assistant

The Simon Fraser University (SFU) Institute for the Study of Teaching and Learning in the Disciplines (ISTLD) invites applications for a Research Assistant appointment, to begin January 8, 2018 (or earlier) to June 29, 2018. Time commitment is 5 - 10 hours/week, \$20.00 - \$25.00/hour (includes 4% vacation and statutory holiday pay), depending on experience and qualifications.

The primary purpose of the ISTLD (http://www.sfu.ca/istld) is to inspire, support, and enhance faculty-led inquiry into all aspects of teaching and learning at SFU. By "faculty-led inquiry" we mean that which is initiated by faculty members and related to ideas or questions about teaching and learning in a specific course, more than one course, at the program level or across programs. This work is supported through the Teaching and Learning Development Grants (TLDG) program (http://www.sfu.ca/tlgrants) and through related work of faculty members and graduate students affiliated with the ISTLD.

Research assistant responsibilities include:

- Participating in ISTLD activities, including the facilitation and administration of ISTLD-sponsored events;
- Working on ISTLD-based research and evaluation activities (e.g. analyze and summarize evaluation information related to ISTLD mandate, such as survey and interview data);
- Providing research support to faculty engaged in investigating teaching and learning, including literature searches and pointers to other relevant TLDG projects;
- Supporting dissemination of project findings within and beyond SFU;
- Undertaking literature reviews related to ISTLD publications;
- Assisting with data entry and evaluation related to TLDG projects' progress/tracking;
- Attending bimonthly ISTLD team meetings.

Required qualifications and skills:

- Currently enrolled in a graduate program at SFU; preference will be given to PhD students in the first or second year of their program.
- Excellent interpersonal skills, including strong oral and written communication skills;
- Ability to work with faculty and graduate students from a wide range of disciplines;
- Some experience with basic qualitative and quantitative data tools and analyses (e.g. SPSS, NVIVO);
- Some experience with instrument design (especially surveys, but also rubrics, interview protocols, observation protocols/checklists, self-reflection tools);
- Ability to undertake literature reviews in disciplines beyond own research area;
- Skilled in use of Microsoft Office suite

Experience and skills that would be an asset:

- Familiarity with reference management software (e.g. Zotero) and database management (e.g. Filemaker);
- Experience with Teaching and Learning research;
- Experience with Excel pivot tables.

Applicants should submit: (1) a 1-page cover letter structured to address the qualifications, skills, and role responsibilities as listed above, and (2) a 1-2 page resumé.
