SAMPLE

POL 223 Canadian American Political Economy (3)

An introductory study of America's Canada's political economy, stressing the interrelated nature of Canada's economic and political life. The course Focuses on current economic problems and policies, taking into account the geographical, historical and political environments.

This course is identical to CNS 280 and students cannot—take both courses for credit. Students with credit for CNS 280 cannot take POL 223_ for further credit.

Recommended Pre-requisite: POL 100 or 101W.

Breadth - Social Sciences.

Reminders:

- 1. Equivalent courses preclusion statement should read: Students with credit for x cannot take y for further credit.
- 2. Adding W designation does not delete the existing course. If the intention is to delete the non-W course, please also fill out the "Course Deletion Form" for that course.
