PRACTICUM OPTIONS – PLEASE INDICATE WHICH PLACEMENT YOU ARE APPLYING FOR

SUMMER PRACTICUM PROGRAM (INTENSIVE)

Mid-April - end of August 2024 (though students may stay until mid Sept. if required)

A 5.5 month, 4 days per week commitment

Students will maintain a caseload of 12–15 client hours per week

One week for holiday/personal time off

FALL/SPRING PRACTICUM PROGRAM

September 2024 – April 2025

An eight-month, 2.5 – 2.75 days per week commitment

Students will maintain a caseload of 7–10 client hours per week

Break during SFU winter closure

THE APPLICATION PACKAGE

Applicants to submit all of the following in one email to lyndsays@sfu.ca:

A 25 - 30-minute video recording of a mock counselling session following these guidelines:

- Provide a digital link to your video. A recorded Zoom session will be accepted if an in-person demo is not possible.
- Assume that basic background information has been collected on an Intake form previously completed by your client. You have reviewed this information prior to the session and are generally aware of your clients presenting issues and concerns. As a part of the intake package, pretend your client has already read and signed off on the limits confidentiality and this was verbally reviewed already (in actual practice, we always review the limits to confidentiality with every client during their first counselling appointment).
- Your mock session should focus on developing rapport, goal formulation, structuring the session, and on basic counselling skills.
- Our goal in requesting a mock video as a part of your application package is to gain a sense of your presence and approach with your client.
- Unless required by your program, you do not need to have your volunteer mock client complete a consent form for the videotaping of the mock session.

2. Letter of intent, including statement of professional objectives for the practicum
3. Current curriculum vitae or resume
4. Transcripts from undergraduate (unofficial transcript will be accepted) and graduate programs (unofficial is okay for application, official transcript required for successful applicants prior to start)
5. Three letters of recommendation from either from academic and/or clinical settings (letter can be sent directly from your referee or included in your email package)

DEADLINE FOR APPLICATION

Summer Practicum: Friday, January 19, 2024 (or open until filled*)

Fall/Spring Practicum: Monday, February 5, 2024 (or open until filled*)

*Practicum applications will continue to be accepted until all positions are filled. Early applications are accepted and encouraged. Please reach out to us if you are passionate about a practicum at HCS - email Lyndsay (lyndsays@sfu.ca) if you would like to learn more about our program.

Applications for the 2024/2025 Summer & Fall/Spring Practicum may be submitted digitally by email to lyndsays@sfu.ca. If an encrypted USB is also required, please mail it to the mailing address below. Please note which practicum you are applying for (or indicate both if applicable).

NOTE: Successful applicants will be required to present a recent Criminal Record Search attesting they are cleared to work with minors and members of vulnerable populations. The period covered must include the entire duration of the practicum.
