ATTENTION: The School limits admission to the upper division of its Major/Joint Major/Minor/Extended Minor programs. Students are eligible to **apply in person to the Undergraduate Advisor** for entry into these programs provided they have been granted admission to the university, have a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.25, and have successfully completed, and received grades for, 60 credit hours, which must include via SFU or transfer credit (with a C- or better in each) the 13 lower division core courses noted above in Group A (CRIM) and Group B (Interdisciplinary)

Upper Division: **MINIMUM** forty-eight (48) credit hours upper division courses, which must include (*check off as completed*):

Minimum 36 credit hours in Criminology (including 300, 320, 321* & 330 each with a C- or better)

Additional 12 credit hours within or outside Criminology Dep't

WARNING: A CGPA of at least 2.25 is required at all times for continuation in the Major Program.

* CRIM 321 is required for the Major in Criminology for students eligible for admission to the Major in September 2002 and thereafter.

*** PLEASE NOTE: Criminology Majors and Minors may not take CRIM 301.**

Upon completion of the above specific requirements, that is, all lower division requirements plus 48 credit hours upper division, the **Major is complete** and the overall credit total should equal at least 108 credit hours.

The difference between 108 hours and 120 hours (minimum for the B.A.) can be made up with lower division **and/or** upper division courses **in any subject**.

If no difference exists because of excess lower division or upper division credits taken, and you are already at 120 credit hours... then congratulations, you are finished the Bachelor of Arts, Major in Criminology! Take this form, together with your transcript to the Criminology Advisor and have it double-checked.

SUGGESTED SEQUENCE FOR COMPLETION OF LOWER DIVISION REQUIREMENTS FOR ADMISSION TO BACHELOR OF ARTS, MAJOR IN CRIMINOLOGY

Following is the **SUGGESTED** sequence for completion of required courses during the first four semesters (60 credit hours) assuming that the student is taking up to fifteen credit hours per semester, and does **NOT** have transfer credit from another post-secondary institution for these requirements.

ATTENTION! Students admitted to the University:

After Fall 2006 → Writing, Quantitative, and Breadth (WQB) Requirements

Students admitted to the University beginning in the fall 2006 semester must complete a total of 36 credit hours of courses designated as meeting writing, quantitative, or breadth requirements with a grade of C- or better.

Prior to Fall 2006 → Faculty of Arts Breadth requirements

Students admitted to the University prior the Fall 2006 semester, who are Majoring/Honouring in Criminology, are required to take a **minimum** of 30 credit hours from **OUTSIDE** the Major or Extended Minor subjects, from at least 5 different departments, with no more than 9 credit hours being allowed from any one of those 5.
