WARNING: You will not be permitted access to ANY upper division (300/400 level) Criminology until these lower division requirements are complete and you have applied to the School of Criminology for an approved EXTENDED MINOR (CRIM).

The School limits admission to the upper division of its Major/Joint Major/Minor/Extended Minor programs. Students are eligible to apply in person to the Undergraduate Advisor for entry into these programs provided they have been granted admission to the university, have a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.25, and have successfully completed 60 credit hours, which must include via SFU or transfer credit (with a C- or better in each) all lower division courses in Group A (CRIM), Group B (Interdisciplinary) and Group C (Elective).

Upper Division: Minimum eighteen (18) credit hours in 300/400 level Criminology coursework. (Note: MINOR students are not eligible to complete CRIM 301-3, CRIM 369-4, CRIM 470-5 or CRIM 462-15.) A C.G.P.A. of 2.25 is required for continuance and graduation.
