

## **CERTIFICATE IN FORENSIC STUDIES**

The Certificate is primarily for students and professionals who wish to focus their criminology undergraduate studies on courses that relate to forensic studies.

The Certificate in Forensic Studies will consist of a minimum of 18 units as follows:

CRIM 355-3 – The Forensic Sciences

Plus 15 units chosen from the following list:

CRIM 356-3 The Forensic Sciences II

CRIM 357-3 Forensic Anatomy

CRIM 416/417/418-3 Current Issues in Criminology and Criminal Justice (when the topic is a forensic studies topic)

CRIM 451-3 Advanced Techniques in Forensic Science

CRIM 452-3 Skeletal Pathology and Criminalistics

CRIM 480-3 Computer Forensics and Cybercrime

ARCH 373-5 Human Osteology

ARCH 383-3 Human Molecular Bioarchaeology

ARCH 442-5 Forensic Anthropology

And any other 300 or 400 division course that is designated as a forensic studies course. Such courses may be in the School of Criminology (*e.g.* Special Topics), or may be in other departments and faculties (*e.g.* Archaeology). See the School's academic advisor for further information.

NOTE: Some courses may have pre-requisites; students are responsible for satisfying the prerequisites for all courses in this certificate. An overall CGPA of 2.25 must be maintained. A minimum of C- is required in all courses. Courses must be completed at Simon Fraser University.
