SFU's Department of Linguistics offers two academic English programs for university-bound students:

**Academic English Skills** is offered for intermediate-level students who are studying at SFU's partner institute, Fraser International College. The program is divided into three 5-hour modules (Reading, Writing, and Speaking/Listening) per week and extends over a period of 14 weeks.

**Preparation in Academic Skills** is designed for low-intermediate students and is offered in three 14-week sessions per year. Students attend 19 hours per week of core classes: Integrated Skills (12 hours) and Global Issues/Canada and the World (7 hours). In addition, students attend three 2-hour tutorials: Research, Fluency, and Grammar.

In either program, instructors may be assigned to one or two of the courses, with one or more sections. Instructors are assigned to courses based on their area of expertise and interest.

Instructors are responsible for preparation of course outlines, activities and assignments; teaching all classes; participating in staff meetings as required; maintaining regular office hours; giving ongoing and final evaluation of student performance; maintaining a website for the course.

#### **Minimum Qualifications**

M.A./M.Ed in TESL or a related field; TESL coursework/certification; expert fluency in English language (IELTS Band 9 or equivalent)

#### **Recommended Qualifications**

Successful experience in teaching in the following areas: English for Academic Purposes (EAP) at intermediate-advanced levels; international students in North American post-secondary settings; English to adults in international academic settings. Also, evidence of successful materials development and lesson planning in EAP; positive teaching evaluations; familiarity with recent developments in computer-assisted language learning; ability to use or learn to use webpage software; strong intercultural communication skills; and demonstrated ability to work with a team of instructors.
