

Karina Vernon is a Postdoctoral Fellow in the Department of English and Film Studies and the Canadian Literature Centre at the University of Alberta specializing in black Canadian cultural studies, Canadian literature, and diaspora theory. Her current project involves editing an anthology of black Canadian prairie writing, titled *Black Atlantis*. She is a publisher and co-founder, along with Wayde Compton and David Chariandy, of Commodore Books, the first black literary press in Western Canada, and she is active with the Hogan's Alley Memorial Project, a grass-roots cultural organization engaged in local archival work toward the publication of an oral history of black Vancouver. She will begin teaching Canadian literature at the University of Toronto Scarborough in the Fall.
