

Barrington Walker is Associate Professor of History at Queen's University. He is author of *Black Felons: Race, Nationhood and the Law in Ontario's Criminal Courts* (University of Toronto Press and Osgoode Society forthcoming) and editor of *Racism and Immigration in Canada: Essential Readings* (Canadian Scholars Press, 2008) and *African Canadians and the Law* (Osgoode Society, forthcoming). He is currently working on two major projects. The first is on Black Canadians' struggle for civil rights in the postwar era and the second is on race, moral regulation and the law in interwar Nova Scotia.
