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The MA Program In Gerontology Ben-Gurion University

The program consists of three subprograms:

A Research program

A Clinical program

 An Organizational - managerial program

Curriculum

Three course modules:

- Basic courses for students in all three tracks
- Program-specific courses
- Elective courses



Basic courses

A module of 9 mandatory courses for students in all three tracks (18 credits):

- Socio-cultural aspect of aging
- Psychology of aging
- Pathophysiology of aging
- Social policy in aging
- Biology of aging
- Epidemiology of aging
- Advanced statistics and methodology
- Computer skills
- Network of services for the aged

Basic courses

- Field work –only for the clinical and organizational-managerial programs
- Research seminar
- Practical experience seminar
- Master's thesis required in the research program and optional in the others

Three clusters of courses (one for each program)

 Some of the courses are mandatory and others can be selected from the 9-10 courses offered by the program (at least 12 credits)

Clinical program:

Focuses on developing skills for case management

- Case management*
- Evaluation and diagnosis of level of functioning*
- Psychogeriatrics
- Rehabilitation in geriatrics
- Stress and coping
- Dementia and other mental problems
- Support systems in the community
- Family support and intergenerational relations*
- Legal aspects of aging

Organizational-managerial:

- Theories of organizations
- Economics*
- Management of institutions & services*
- Financial planning and management*
- Organizational development
- Management of personnel
- Quality assurance

Research program:

Designed according to the student's special interest

- Advanced research methods*
 (qualitative, quantitative, clinical experiments)
- Geriatrics and pharmacology
- Cognition and aging
- Neuropsychology of aging

Elective courses

- Inter-program courses: 16 courses available
- Program-specific courses offered by other programs
- University courses: Students may substitute MA level courses taught at the University for up to two of the elective courses

Elective courses

- Nutrition and health in aging
- Retirement
- Work and leisure in aging
- Death, dying and bereavement
- Holocaust survivors and aging
- Health promotion and health education
- Physical exercise in old age

Students

The target population are graduates in:

- Medical professions (physicians, nurses, physiotherapists, nutritionists etc.)
- Social sciences (behavioral sciences)
- Management & administration
- Admission criteria: A BA degree from a recognized university, with a grade average of at least 80 (on a 100-point scale)

Demand and admission

 Each year we select about 40 students out of 100-120 applicants

 By the end of this academic year, approximately 100 students will complete their studies

 The reputation of the program is high and the demand is constant.
