- Masters program 1988 (refreshed in 2004)
- Ph.D. program September 2003
- Programs are research oriented
- Located in the Research Centre on Aging of the Sherbrooke University Institute of Geriatrics (32 researchers in aging – from cell to society!)

Masters

- Knowledge is acquired through research analysis and practice
- Aim of program: contribution to knowledge development
- A multidisciplinary approach
- Our program proposes an objective, scientific and critical approach on issues related to aging
- 45 credits:
 - 18 content;
 - 9 thesis preparation;
 - 18 thesis

Masters

Each student will:

- 1) Acquire knowledge on aging (bio-medical, psychological and sociological)
- 2) Analyse gerontological issues in different disciplines
- Appropriate notions and tools to achieve a strong methodological background: conception phase and research designs, advance statistics and qualitative gerontology
- 4) Contribute to the development of Gerontology (thesis)
- 5) Communicate abilities for result dissemination (oral and written)
- 6) Contribute to the renewal of gerontological practices

Ph.D.

- Inter-faculty program (Human sciences, Medicine and Physical Education)
- An interdisciplinary approach

- 90 credits:
 - 24- content;
 - 30- thesis preparation;
 - 36- Thesis

Ph.D.

Each student will:

- 1) Integrate different disciplines in Gerontology
- 2) Produce new knowledge
- 3) Conceptualise, realise and manage research projects
- 4) Enhance their knowledge and abilities in research methodology
- 5) Become familiar with various political, socio-economical and technological issues of aging via articulated discourses
- 6) Develop a distinctive competence for interdisciplinary work and partnership research
- 7) Transfer scientific knowledge in different spheres of psychosocial intervention (ex: clinical, social politics, distribution of information to the public)

Possibilities for collaboration

- Research projects, research collaboration
- Conferences
- Summer research training via student exchange programs
- Teaching is performed in French BUT... 90% of the material is in English (scientific articles)
- Papers, presentations and thesis can be produced in English
