Plenary Speakers

Kirk Heilbrun, Ph.D., is currently Professor and Head of the Department of Psychology at Drexel University, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. His current research focuses on juvenile and adult offenders, legal decision-making, and forensic evaluation associated with such decision-making. He is a past president of both the American Psychology-Law Psychology/APA Division 41, and the American Board of Forensic Psychology.

Trevor Hurwitz, MBChB, MRCP (UK), FRCPC, is a Clinical Professor in the Department of Psychiatry at the University of British Columbia. He is the Director of the BC Neuropsychiatry Program and Chief-of-Service of West-1 at UBC Hospital, Vancouver. Dr. Hurwitz has a joint appointment in the Department of Medicine, Division of Neurology, and practices as a clinical neurologist in addition to his primary commitment to inpatient and outpatient neuropsychiatry

Edward P. Mulvey, Ph.D., is director of the law and psychiatry program at the Western Psychiatric Institute and Clinic of the University of Pittsburgh, School of Medicine.

Randy Otto, Ph.D., is an Associate Professor in the Department of Mental Health Law and Policy, Florida Mental Health Institute, University of South Florida. He has served as president of the American Psychology-Law Society, and he is a past president of the American Academy of Forensic Psychology.
