## Symposium Contributors:

### **Nathen Aswell, Vancouver,**

is a multi-instrumentalist (voice, bass, guitar and Stick) and has been a professional musician for almost twenty years. Since his study of electro-acoustic music at Concordia University in Montreal, his ears haven't been the same; he now hears ALL sound as musical. As a member of the World Forum for Acoustic Ecology (WFAE), Nathen delights in leading monthly soundwalks in and around Vancouver to help raise awareness of the city's soundscape. ### **Sabine Breitsameter, Berlin,**

was born in Bavaria, Germany, in 1960 and is now based in Berlin. From 1979 to 1985, she completed studies in journalism, musicology, literature and ethnology with a thesis about the borderline between radio drama and avant-garde music. She has lived in Africa, the Middle East, India and South East Asia and now works in radio, doing cultural programming, as author and director of original sound documentaries. In 1995, she initiated and organized "KANGUMWELTEN", a three-day symposium on sound at the Akademie der Künste in Berlin and for the last year has broadcast a weekly one-hour radioart program at Sender Freies Berlin.

### **Darren Copeland, Toronto,**

is an electro-acoustic composer whose phonograms for the media of Acousmatic Tape, Theatre, Dance, and Radio explore the imagistic properties of environmental sounds. His principle teachers have been Barry Truax and the late Martin Bartlett at Simon Fraser University.

### **Claude Schryer, Montreal,**

is a Montreal-based composer and producer. Born in 1959 in Ottawa, Ontario, he was raised in a Franco-Ontarian community in North Bay. He studied at Wilfrid Laurier University, The Banff Centre, McGill University, University of East Anglia and La muse en circuit. He is an active composer, performer, producer and curator of new music and interdisciplinary productions. He was artistic director of the Inter-Arts program at the Banff Centre for the Arts from 1988 to 1990 and co-founder of the media art production group "Diffusion in MeDIA" and the electroacoustic music CD label, "empreintes DIGITALes". He was artistic director of the "7e Printemps electroacoustique", held in June, 1992 in Montreal, and for the "Association pour la creation et la recherche electroacoustiques de Quebec" (ACREQ) for the 1992-93 season. In 1992, he released "Sound Letter", a compact disc compilation of electroacoustic works on the theme of ecology. He now specializes in the field of electroacoustic ecology, radio art, and music theatre.

### **Barry Truax, Vancouver,**

is a Professor in both the School of Communication and the School for the Contemporary Arts at Simon Fraser University where he teaches courses in acoustic communication and electroacoustic music. He has worked with the World Soundscape Project, editing its *Handbook for Acoustic Ecology*, and has published a book *Acoustic Communication* dealing with all aspects of sound and technology. As a composer, Truax is best known for his work with the PODX computer music system which he has used for tape solo works and those which combine tape with live performers or computer graphics. A selection of these pieces may be heard on the recording *Sequence of Earlier Heaven*, and the Compact Discs *Digital Soundscapes*, *Pacific Rim* and *Song of Songs*, all on the Cambridge Street Records label. In 1991, his work *Riverrun* was awarded the Magisterium at the International Competition of Electroacoustic Music in Bourges, France, a category open only to electroacoustic composers of 20 or more years experience.

### **Hans Ulrich Werner, Vancouver,**

is doing radio production at the Studio for Sound Design at the Westdeutscher Rundfunk in Cologne, Germany. He has completed technical, musical and media studies and has written a PhD dissertation about soundscapes - "akustische Landschaften". He has collaborated with Prof. Ipsen, Kassel University, Department of Empirical Planning Research, on the book/CD publication "KLANGWEGE" 1991/1995. In 1992, he produced film and sound collages about Chicago, in 1994 the soundscape CD "Lisboa" with Michael Ruesenberg, sound reporter of ZwergProductions, Cologne, and in 1995 "Soundscape Madrid" with Michael Ruesenberg, Francisco Lopez, Pedro Elias and the Goethe-Institut Madrid.

### **Hildegard Westerkamp, Vancouver,**

is a German native and has lived in Vancouver since 1968. She is a freelance composer/audio artist who has taught acoustic communication at Simon Fraser University and has given soundscape workshops internationally. She is a founding member of the World Forum for Acoustic Ecology and has edited the Soundscape Newsletter since 1991.
