
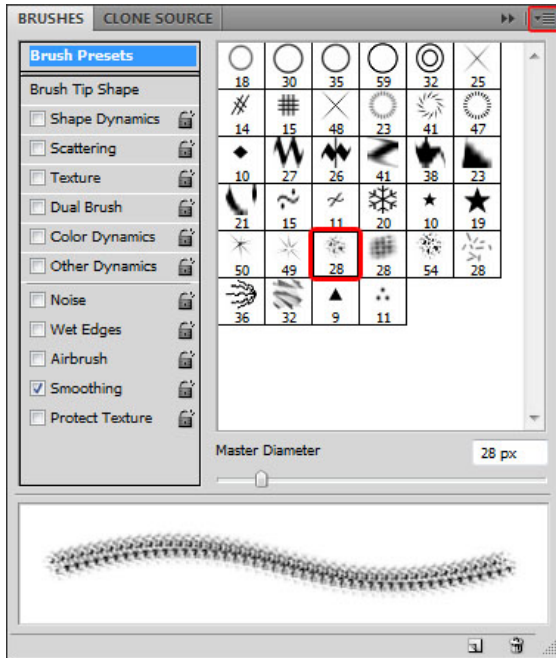


Crayon Brush Tutorial

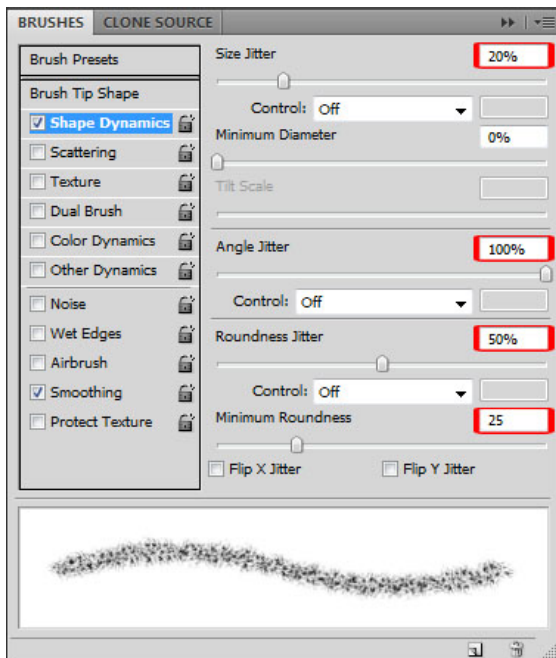
1. Select the brush tool (B)  and open up the brush panel by clicking on Window > Brushes (F5).



2. Click on the icon on the top right of this panel and select 'Assorted Brushes', then click 'Ok' to replace the current brushes.

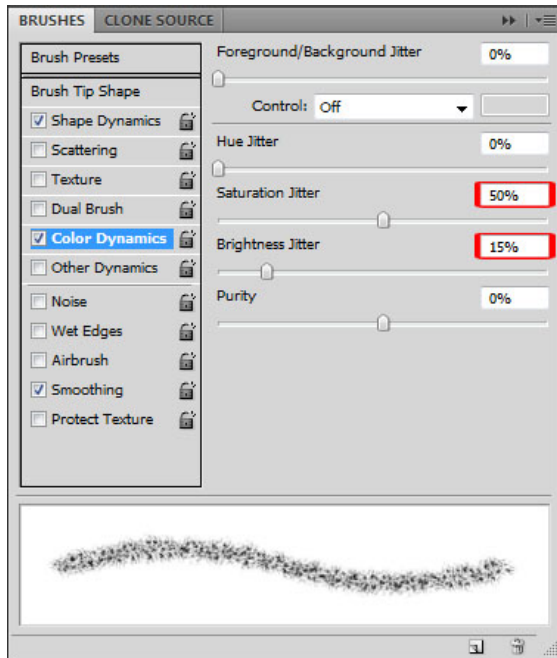
You should see these set of brushes appear in the panel, select the one whose size is 28 ('Texture 1' if in list view).

At this point you should have a stroke similar to the one in the picture.



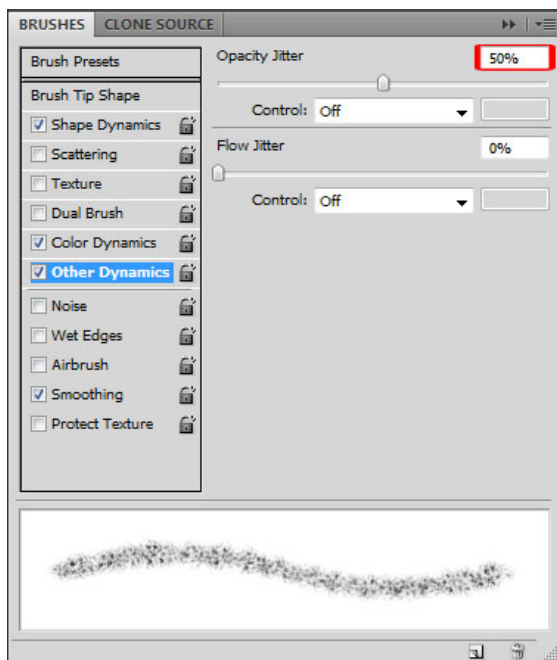
3. Click on 'Shape Dynamics' and change the following properties:

Size Jitter: 20%, Angle Jitter: 100%,
Roundness Jitter: 50%, Minimum
Roundness: 25%




4. Click on 'Color Dynamics' and change the following properties:

Saturation Jitter: 50%, Brightness Jitter: 15%

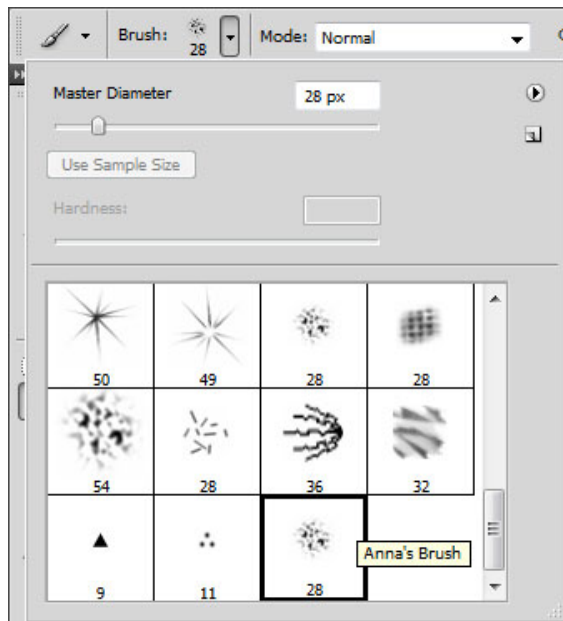


5. Click on 'Other Dynamics' and change the following properties:

Opacity Jitter: 50%

6. Click on the icon on the bottom right  of the panel to save your brush and give it a name.

Click 'Ok' and it should appear in the brushes panel on the top left like so.



If you'd like to keep this brush, you'd have to have it in an .ABR file (a photoshop brush file) by clicking the arrow on the top right of this panel and selecting 'Save Brushes', this is save all the current brushes in this set as a new set. The new brush set should be saved under C:\Program Files\Adobe\Adobe Photoshop CS4\Presets\Brushes.
