of isolation and disconnection in the urban environment.



modern world. In 2008, she was awarded the TED Prize in support of her call for the creation of a "Charter for Compassion", a document now endorsed by Archbishop Desmond Tutu and the Dalai Lama. The "12 Days of Compassion", hosted by SFU Dialogue, was a major campaign that culminated in a high-profile live event and TED Talks webcast that was distributed on CharterforCompassion.org, LiveStream,

FaceBook, and TED.com to a massive international audience.






Image: Karen Armstrong: The Charter for Compassion website & live webcast



for educational distribution in British Columbia high schools.






Image: The Fraser River Journey website & DVD cover

The videos are designed to facilitate a dialog among older adults, promoting awareness and greater understanding about various topics of interest to seniors.




Image: A Place for Everyone: Age-friendly Communities DVD cover
