Pakistan and India: A Search for Common Humanity

American journalist Ethan Casey (www.ethancasey.com), author of *Alive and Well in Pakistan: A Human Journey in a Dangerous Time*, will report and show slides from his recent six-week trip to *Pakistan and India* in a free public lecture at the SFU Surrey campus.

Casey's book has become a touchstone for Western readers seeking an accessible wider context to recent events in and involving Pakistan, and for Pakistanis who appreciate an affectionate portrayal of their country. Ahmed Rashid, author of *Taliban and Descent Into Chaos*, has written that

“Pakistan just happens to be one of the most complex and difficult countries to describe, but Casey does a magnificent job.”



In his book, blog (blog.aliveandwellinpakistan.com), and other work, Casey assiduously avoids making US foreign policy priorities his starting point. Instead, he listens carefully and respectfully to what Pakistanis tell him about their country's situation and how it affects their lives. A veteran correspondent, Casey has reported from throughout South and Southeast Asia since the 1990s for leading publications including *The Globe and Mail*, and has written columns for the Pakistani newspapers *The News* and *Daily Times*. He lives in Seattle, visits the Lower Mainland often, and is writing a new book updating his Pakistani experience, based on his recent trip.
