Presenter:

1. Does the title of the presentation make the subject and the conclusion/thesis clear?
2. Does the presenter set up the problem clearly for the audience? Is the level of sophistication appropriate for the audience? Does the presenter discuss methods and the limits (scope) of the study?
3. Are the data credible and given in a clear format that makes the audience reach the clear conclusion that the presenter suggests?
4. Does the presenter spread eye contact throughout the room and project their voice so the farthest person can clearly hear and follow them? Do they speak from bullet points to jog their memory, rather than reading from notes?
5. Does the presenter lead the audience to reach the same conclusion and set out a research agenda of q.s that need to be addressed?
6. Does the presenter bring the audience back to the original thesis and answer the question by the end of the presentation?
7. Is each slide well-formatted, and easy to read?
8. Does the presenter use graphs, tables, and photos to better illustrate the points?
9. Does the presenter stay within the time limits?
10. Is the presenter able to anticipate and field objections and questions?
