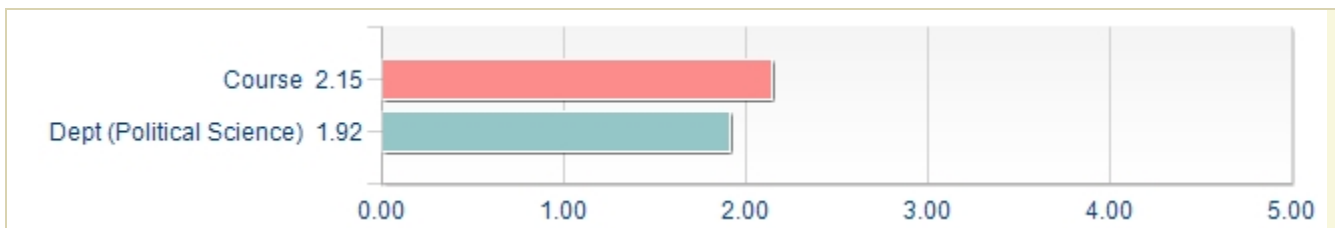

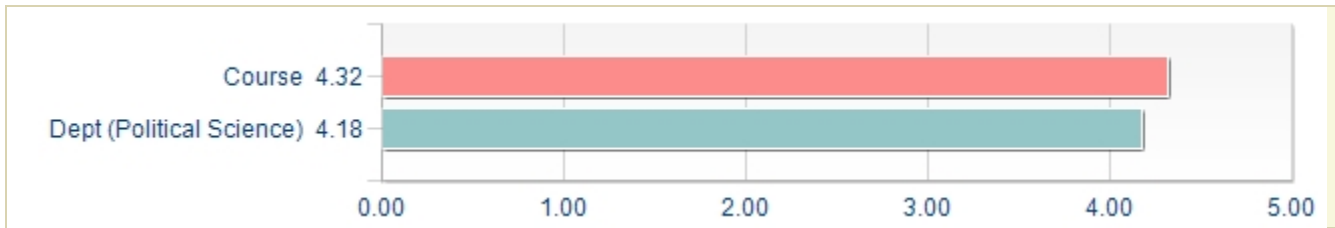

This course was fabulous. From the get-go I knew I would have to engage and apply myself. Anil set clear expectation for us. We were to be treated like adults and that is how he treated us. We could not slack off, we needed to come prepared, or we would not succeed. I wish that more professors were like Anil, how else can students prepare for the real world? After taking this course, I can say that I understand the world better -- I look at the issues going on around me and apply what I have learned in POL 253 to better understand them. I think that should be the goal of every professor, so I see the work Anil does as success. My one complaint is that I do not believe the grading system is fair for midterms. I worked hard every week, I participated in class and tutorial, received a good grade on assignments, and did fairly well on 2 out of the 3 sections on my midterm (I received a B on the essay section, and A's and B's on the written section). Yet, I received a C+ on my midterm because I did not know the definition of 2 terms for the multiple choice section. I lost 10% of my midterm grade because I got 2 multiple choice questions wrong. Considering how hard I worked, I do not think this is fair -- I missed 2 small definitions and went down a letter grade. I don't think that is how the real world works. A real boss would see how hard I worked, recognise my effort, and not get caught up in small details (at least in my opinion).
Other than this one qualm, I can definitely say that the content and instruction I received in POL 253 one some of the most valuable things I have learned at SFU over the last 4 years.
