#### 1. TSSU organizer (Al Fleischmann)

- Discussion regarding issues for women in TSSU.
- 80% of TSSU are grad students.
- Committees have approx. 50/50 representation but not enough women's issues on agenda, although founded on feminist principles, decentralized ethic. Safety on campus: dist. Ed. TA's required to supervise exams alone in evenings; should be mandatory to have someone else there.

Deleted: ¶

- International Women's Day should be in the TA logbook.
- 1/3 of space lost for ed. grad students reimbursement for expenses incurred from working at home like internet services, special ph. services would be helpful.
- Equity for distance ed and online courses (*i.e.* online course instructors have to print themselves if they want hard copies of assignments).
- Dental plan needs revision (this is not a TSSU-SFU bargaining issue).
- Cher asked how many of 1400 TSSU members are female; this would require physically going through the contracts.
- Sexual harassment info should be included with welcome packages.
- Issue of people external to SFU occupying sessional instructors positions that TA's and TM's would like to have (concerns about right of first refusal language) can TSSU represent the best interests of both sessionals and TA's?

### 2. Proposed tuition increases (Mark/Hartley)

- 20, 25, 30% increases are the options put forward by SFU.
- SFSS has put forward alternative suggestion to have specific cuts to the budget to make up \$15m deficit (ie. cut \$3m in new projects, carry forward monies of \$12m).
- Motion to present this budget to the faculty for consideration (carried).
- Kumari would like to have EGSA put together a position paper on the impact of these tuition increases on grad students.
- If increase goes ahead SFU would have 2nd highest tuition fees in Canada-Isabelle noted last increase of 35% was justified on basis of \$9m shortfall; how has deficit doubled? Pressure to raise rates for M. Ed. programs? Grad programs has operating budget of only \$38,000.
- Call to go out on listserve tomorrow asking for statements to be forwarded to Kumari within a week and she will compile for Isabelle to discuss with Kelleen on Jan. 29
- First week in Feb. EGSA social could circulate petition at that time.
- Budget forums are being held Jan. 15, 22, 29.

#### 3. Logo (Mahboubeh)
