Dutch minelayer NAUTILUS was sunk at 0130 today as result of collision with SS MURRAYFIELD off the Humber. There were no casualties.

Photographs at 1730 showed 3 destroyers and a catapult ship in Trondheim. Most of the coast was fog bound.
