DAVID L. BAILLIE GRADUATE FELLOWSHIPS IN MOLECULAR AND CELLULAR BIOLOGY

Terms of Reference

- 1. The purpose of this award is to provide financial support for students pursuing a PhD degree in the Molecular Biology and Biochemistry program.
- 2. The David L. Baillie Graduate Fellowships in Molecular and Cellular Biology are one-semester awards valued at a portion of the earned income from the endowment. Two awards, each valued at a minimum of \$2,500, will be tenable in the Fall semester.
- 3. The criteria for this award are:
 - a) full-time registration at Simon Fraser University in a doctoral program in the Department of Molecular Biology and Biochemistry in the Faculty of Science;
 - b) applicants must have completed a minimum of two years towards their PhD program;
 - c) demonstrated academic and research excellence at the post-graduate level with particular emphasis on intellectual ability, originality and ability in research.
- 4. This award may be held in conjunction with other awards made by Simon Fraser University or other agencies where permitted by those agencies.
- 5. Application is made on the **Application for a Private Graduate Scholarship** form and must be accompanied by:
 - a) a current, unofficial SFU transcript OR an official transcript from the most recent degree program at another post-secondary institution for a student just entering the PhD program at SFU;
 - b) a concise description (one page or less) of the proposed or actual thesis research project;
 - c) a resume summarizing scholastic achievements and work relevant to the aims of this scholarship;
 - d) two letters of reference: one letter of reference from the student's supervisor and a second letter of reference from someone other than the supervisor who is familiar with the applicant's research abilities.
- 6. The completed application and supporting documentation must be received by the department of enrolment by May 30.
- 7. The award will be made by the Dean of Graduate Studies on behalf of the Senate Graduate Awards Adjudication Committee.
