A Formal Syntax Account of the English Auxiliary System

Noam Chomsky, *Syntactic Structures*, 1957

I. Phrase Structure Rules:

$S \rightarrow NP \text{ AuxP VP}$

$\text{AuxP} \rightarrow T (M) (\text{have}+\text{en}) (\text{be}+\text{ing})$

$\text{VP} \rightarrow V (\text{NP})$

$\text{NP} \rightarrow (D) N$

$T \rightarrow \{\text{pres, past}\}$

$M \rightarrow \{\text{can, may, will, shall, must}\}$

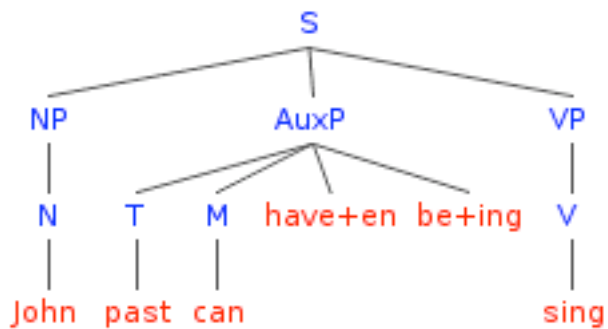
II. Transformational Rules:

Affix Hopping

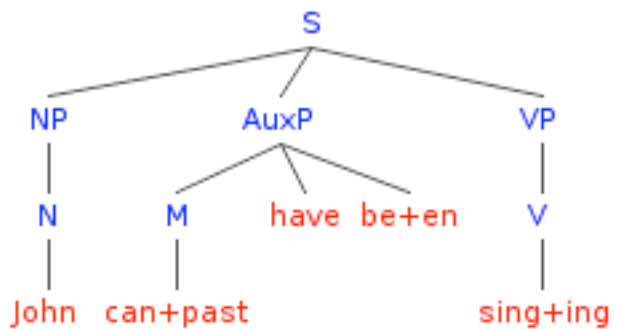
$\text{AF } X \Rightarrow X+\text{AF}$, where $\text{AF} = \{\text{pres, past, en, ing}\}$
