Type of verb (and they occur in this order):

- 1. Modal auxiliary or Dummy auxiliary DO
- 2. Perfect HAVE
- 3. Progressive BE
- 4. Passive BE
- 5. Main verb

Form of verb:

Present tense
Past tense
(Bare) infinitive [Base form]
Present participle
Past participle

Rules for combining verbs:

Modal (or Dummy auxiliary DO) + bare infinitive (base form)
Perfect HAVE + past participle
Progressive BE + present participle
Passive BE + past participle

Finiteness is expressed as tense and agreement in English:

Tense: present or past.

Subject-verb agreement: Non-modal present tense verbs with 3rd person

singular subjects add -s: He sings.

Finite verb is always the first one.

Principle parts of the English verb: present tense, past tense, past participle:

Regular: walk, walked, walked Irregular: sing, sang, sung

freeze, froze, frozen

Very irregular: *am/is/are, was/were, been (being, be)*

Dummy auxiliary DO is used when an auxiliary is needed for negation, emphasis, or

inversion: He did not sing, He did sing!, Did he sing?
