Details regarding volunteer youth leadership experience:

I was a leader for Tech Teams which is a volunteer program designed for first year students who are in Tech One at SFU Surrey. Students one year older act as mentors and facilitate weekly meetings where students get a chance to socialize and participate in various activities. There are workshops for developing software skills as well as tours to grad research areas in the Surrey Campus. Occasionally, local experts are brought in to talk about design in the industry or more personal experiences.

I was the elected president of the 1st Gibsons Venturer Company and participated regularly in camping and outdoor activities as well as community and environmental service. As the chairperson I chaired weekly meetings and was responsible for the executive committee which planned all of our activities and camps. Now I am a member of the 1st Gibsons Rovers for which I am the secretary.

In July 2007, I participated as offer of service at the province-wide camp run by Scouts Canada called the Provincial Jamboree, or PJ. My role was as a volunteer first-aid and first responder, which required training outside of the camp.

Camp Logjam is located in Camp Capilano, North Vancouver, and is a full week overnight Scout camp. As a staff member, my duties included looking after children from the ages of 5-7 and the organizing of hikes, crafts, campfires for overnights, and many other spontaneous duties. I volunteered at this camp in 2003, 2004, and 2005.

Other volunteer experience for Scouts Canada includes working as an activities leader at Wolf-Howl, a local week-long camp for children of the ages of 8-11 in 2003 and 2004. In addition, in 2005 I participated as a youth leader for children from the ages of 11-13 during a three-day hike and camp on the Baden Powell Trail in North Vancouver. In 2004 I assumed the same role on a 5 day hiking expedition to Black Tusk in Garibaldi Provincial Park.

As an SCRCD day-camp volunteer, my duties included supervision and entertainment of kids from ages 6-12 in a day-camp setting. For one week I was required to take the ferry each morning to Gambier Island and work with limited staff. There were 2 of us, one having a paid job and me, the volunteer, but my role was almost equivalent if only that I was younger (age 15).

Details regarding past high school activities:

During my senior year of high school, I was elected Grad Council Secretary by my peers. I also volunteered my time to make the school's yearbook in both my grade eleven and grade twelve years. In my grad year, I performed the role of yearbook editor. I played trumpet as a member of the school concert band for the five years I was in high school. I also played piano with the school's jazz band in my grad year.

During high-school I was able to experience international travel twice through school-sanctioned trips. The first was in 2004 when I traveled to France and Spain for ten days with the school's travel club. The second trip was in 2006 when I traveled to Sapporo, Japan for ten days. I was hosted by local families and attended a few classes at a sister school to my own. Although short, I feel both experiences have strongly helped me become who I am.
