



The GPL places certain restrictions on the distribution of work so that it cannot be modified and closed off to sell at a profit.

Software licensed under the GPL must contain the source code when being distributed. Not only that, any program that uses anything licensed using the GPL must make its source code available as well.



The GPL is a form of copyleft. Copyleft is a play on the word copyright.

Unlike copyright, GPL allows all work to be modified and redistributed as long as it follows the same licensing agreement as the original work.
