Fall 2017 Funding Opportunities for Patient-Oriented Research Projects

Planning projects:

Planning Award for Patient-Oriented Research and Knowledge Translation, offered by BC SUPPORT Unit Fraser Centre

Application Deadline: November 15th, 2017

The objective of the planning award is to support patient-oriented planning activities and partnership development that will contribute to the advancement of research, evidence uptake and implementation consistent with the mandate of <u>CIHR Strategy for Patient-Oriented Research</u>. The award will support teams in the Fraser region in partnering with patients and other stakeholders to plan research studies or knowledge translation projects (knowledge dissemination or implementation).

There will be up to five planning awards. Each award amount will be up to \$10,000 for a maximum duration of 12 months.

• Feasibility or pilot projects:

Pathway to Patient-Oriented Research (P2P) Award, offered by the BC SUPPORT Unit and the Michael Smith Foundation for Health Research

Application Deadline: October 30th, 2017

P2P Awards are offered by the BC SUPPORT Unit in partnership with the <u>Michael Smith Foundation for</u> <u>Health Research (MSFHR)</u>. These awards help BC-based <u>patient-oriented research</u> teams pilot and test the feasibility of their project, to make future grant applications stronger.

There will be up to five P2P Awards in 2018. Each award amount will be up to \$20,000 for a maximum duration of 12 months.

<u>Research & capacity building projects</u>: <u>SPOR Collaborative Grant Competition, offered by CIHR</u> Application Deadline: November 14th, 2017

The goal of this funding opportunity is to support research teams that contribute to capacity building efforts in patient-oriented research, as identified in the <u>SPOR Capacity Development Framework</u>, and catalyze opportunities for new/early career investigators to learn in the context of patient-oriented research teams. Projects that can be supported include planning, team building, stand-alone patient-oriented research projects, and enhancing current projects to be patient-oriented.

There is funding available for approximately 40 awards of \$40,000 for one year of funding.

Innovation and impact projects:

Rewarding Success Initiative, offered by <u>CIHR</u> Application Deadline: November 18th, 2017

<u>Rewarding Success</u> is for multidisciplinary research teams and their partners to enhance value-based care, health system sustainability, and health outcomes. Teams will design, implement, and evaluate interventions in health care delivery organization(s) that aim to produce health care cost savings and/or improved health system efficiency. This is an experimental funding model has three phases and is being piloted in five provinces: British Columbia, Alberta, Manitoba, Saskatchewan, and Newfoundland & Labrador.
