Window into pre-history

WAIROA lagoons are giving scientists insight into pre-historic earthquakes and tsunami, and more recent geological events.

A team of scientists from the University of Southern Mississippi and GNS Science have been surveying various field sites along the East Coast looking for evidence of past tsunami and earthquake events.

The lagoons east of Wairoa are known to contain a good archive of old earthquakes and tsunamis but the current focus is on more recent events.

A sediment core taken at Ohuia Lagoon near Wairoa is already of interest to the scientists but before they can say for sure whether or not these cores provide evidence of past tsunami events, the sediment needs to be analysed.

"Finding evidence of large tsunamis and earthquakes that have hit the area pre-historically can help us learn more about what might happen in the future," said GNS Science's Dr Ursula Cochran.

The scientists initially carry out a visual assessment of sediment layers and, if considered worthwhile, they take a sediment core using a long, steel, tubular sediment corer.

The corer is pushed as far into the ground as possible; when it can't go any further, it's pulled to the surface and then analysed.

University of Southern Mississippi assistant professor Jessica Pilarczyk said: "We'll take these cores back to the lab and look at them under the microscope, and do things like high-resolution grain size analysis, palaeontological analysis and geochemical analysis.

While this analysis takes time, it will help provide evidence of

The Shop Trading Hours Act 1990 was amended in 2016 to enable territorial authorities to create local policies to allow wider shop trading across their entire district or in designated areas on Easter Sunday.

The Wairoa Waikaremoana Maori Trust Board scholarship was established in 2012 to encourage the participation of beneficiaries of the Wairoa Waikaremoana Maori Trust Board to achieve academic qualifications at a diploma level or higher.

The Board has allocated funds of \$45,000 over a 3 year period, to support three students to achieve academic success at a New Zealand Tertiary Institution.

The Board Scholarships are available for approved studies at a New Zealand tertiary education institute for a term of three consecutive years in full-time or limited full-time study at the following levels:

- Undergraduate (Diploma)
- Undergraduate/Bachelor Degree

The Board will prioritise applicants who have enrolled in disciplines of strategic benefit to the Trust Board and the Wairoa district. Each scholarship will be to the value of \$5000 per year, for a maximum of 3 years to be paid in installments of \$2500. The first instalment will be paid on approval of application and further instalments will be paid at the beginning of each following semester. Subsequent instalments will be subject to proof of applicants' completion and achievement of the previous academic year.
