The following new courses and calendar changes were approved by the Faculty of Arts at its meeting November 28, 1966. The Faculty would like both the new courses and calendar changes to be in effect before the start of the January semester. Can you, therefore, submit them to Senate for approval?

New courses for History department:

History

222-3 Nineteenth Century Europe.

A study of the changing cultural, social, political and economic character of Europe from 1815 to 1914, emphasizing conditions peculiar to the whole of Europe. (2-1-0)

261-3 The Overseas Expansion and Impact of Europe After 1815.

An outline of the colonial aims, achievements and conflicts of Portugal, Spain, Holland, France, Great Britain, Germany, Italy, Russia and the United States of America, with special reference to their impact on Africa and Asia. (2-1-0)

The United States as a World Power.

A study of adaptation of American institutions to the new conditions arising from the emergence of the United States as a world power, examining in:

441-5 Foreign Policy.

Honors Courses

491-3 Honors Seminar: Research Methods.

A general introduction to principles of historical criticism, principles and practices of annotation, historical editing and transcription of source material, history and contemporary social science techniques, problems of research in primary sources, and the problem of generalization in history. (0-3-0)

New courses for Philosophy department:

434-3 Kant

A critical examination of selected writings of Immanuel Kant.

440-5 Seminar I

This seminar will be devoted to the study of a selected philosophic topic.

New courses for the Department of Modern Languages:

105-1 Elementary French

Practical Phonetics, Pronunciation, and Transcription Exercises. Offers intensive training in pronunciation and transcription. Required of all honours and majors and highly recommended for all students of French. It should be taken concurrently with the first language course taken at the university. (0-1-0)

105-1 Elementary German

Practical Phonetics, Pronunciation, and Transcription Exercises. Offers intensive training in pronunciation and transcription. Required of all honours and majors and highly recommended for all students of German. It should be taken concurrently with the first language course taken at the university. (0-1-0)

105-1 Elementary Russian

Practical Phonetics, Pronunciation, and Transcription Exercises. Offers intensive training in pronunciation and transcription. Required of all honours and majors and highly recommended for all students of Russian. It should be taken concurrently with the first language course taken at the university. (0-1-0)

105-1 Elementary Spanish

Practical Phonetics, Pronunciation, and Transcription Exercises. Offers intensive training in pronunciation and transcription. Required of all honours and majors and highly recommended for all students of Spanish. It should be taken concurrently with the first language course taken at the university. (0-1-0)

100-3 Introductory Hindi

Acquisition of spoken fluency and reading facility. (1-1-3)

Calendar changes:

Department of Economics and Commerce. Change semester hours credit of 370-5 Business Management from 5 to 3.

Department of Modern Languages.

Change vector of French 100-3, French 101-3, Spanish 100-3, Spanish 101-3, Russian 100-3, Russian 101-3, German 100-3, German 101-3 from (1-5-2) to (1-1-3).

Change vector of 220-3 (Linguistics) and 221-3 (Linguistics) from (2-1-0) to (2-1-1).

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It would be appreciated if you could amend the submission to Senate from the Faculty of Arts of courses to be offered in January 1967 in this way:

History department:

Delete 442-5 Domestic Politics.

Add:

Cultural and Political History of Canada

An examination of emerging Canadian nationhood in terms of its regional, ethnic, continental, and international tensions, examining in:
