At its meeting of November 20th, the Interdisciplinary Committee on Kinesiology passed the following motion:

The Committee requests the Senate Committee on Graduate Studies to change M.Sc. (Education) to M.Sc. (Kinesiology).

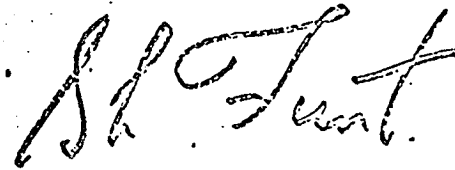
The basis for this request stems from the belief that the M.Sc. (Education) reflects a more professional type program than is currently in effect or envisaged for Kinesiology.

To date, no students have received the degree of M.Sc. (Education) and therefore this may be an appropriate time to institute the change that the Department recommends and that the Committee has approved.

On the other hand, when last discussed in the Faculty of Science some two years ago, there was opposition to the title M.Sc. (Kinesiology). I include this statement for the sake of record only as it will be argued that the Faculty of Science is not directly involved in the program under the supervision of the Kinesiology Committee.
