RECOMMENDATIONS:

Students taking the minor in conjunction with a major must fulfill requirements in at least two departments other than that of the major.
3. That the attached list of Canadian content courses be approved for use in the programme.

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Background Information:

Senate, in its meeting of November 2, 1970 approved the establishment of a minor degree in Canadian Studies. The above recommendations have been determined by the Canadian Studies Steering Committee to be the minimum requirements necessary for the completion of the programme.
