BACKGROUND STATEMENT

Senate Document S. 71-89, approved July 1971, established a Minor Degree program in Africa/Middle East Studies under which students are required to complete at least 23 semester hours (9 at the lower levels and 14 at the upper levels). Of these 23 hours only one of A/ME 401-5 or 402/5 is required. The remaining 18 hours may be selected from any of the courses approved for inclusion by the A/ME Steering Committee and ratified by Senate (this list of courses was approved by Senate under S. 71-34 in February, 1971). Courses approved on the list are those offered in departments which have either full or partial content in Africa and/or the Middle East. The course under consideration here, History 476-5 East Africa, was overlooked in the compilation of the original list and we wish to add it at this time.
