

3. JUSTIFICATION

- A. What is the detailed description of the course including differentiation from lower level courses, from similar courses in the same department, and from courses in other departments in the University?

This course and Philosophy 478-5 are to replace the former Honors Tutorial 474-10. Some students in the Department have found that taking 10 credit hours in one semester has precluded their taking other required or desired courses which are not repeated in the subsequent semester and consequently they cannot fulfil all the requirements of the program. By dividing the Honors Tutorial into two blocks of units which can be taken either concurrently or consecutively we can introduce a much-needed degree of flexibility into students' planning of courses.

The same as that covered by the former Honors Tutorial 474-10.
 (One half of workload in 477-5 and one half in 478-5)
