Date November 21, 1977

Action taken by the Senate Committee on Undergraduate Studies at its meeting of November 15, 1977 gives rise to the following motions:

MOTION 1

"That the proposed change in lower division requirements as set forth in S.77-147, be approved and recommended to the Board for approval."

Note - there is in fact no change in requirements per se, merely the addition of a sentence providing guidance for students who are asked to note that many of the 200 division courses are prerequisites for upper division courses.

MOTION 2

"That the change in requirements for joint Honors in Sociology and Anthropology, as set forth in S.77-147, be approved and recommended to the Board for approval."

Note - the only substantive change is the deletion of S.A. 498 (Honors Semester) since it is proposed that course be discontinued.

MOTION 3

"That the change in prerequisites for S.A.255-4, 280-4, 290-4, 300-4, 304-4, 320-4, 331-4, 363-4, 370-4, 374-4, 386-4, 391-4, 393-4, 394-4, 396-4, 401-4, 405-4, 409-4, 416-4, 427-4, 463-4, 464-4, 467-4, 468-4, 477-4, 480-4, 486-4, 495-4, as set forth in S.77-147, be approved and recommended to the Board for approval."

MOTION 4

"That the proposal to discontinue and delete from the calendar S.A. 498-12 (Honors Semester) be approved and recommended to the Board for approval.

MOTION 5

"That the proposed additional paragraph related to change in lower division requirements, as set forth in S.77-147, be approved and recommended to the Board for approval.

Note - since the department has proposed extensive revision of prerequisites, students are directed to earlier calendars in the event they wish to be governed by earlier prerequisite requirements.

Page 217: B. Gartrell and A.T. McLaren are new faculty members in the Department of Sociology & Anthropology.

Page 218: Introductory paragraph - The members of the Department felt that the reference in the first sentence of this paragraph was of purely historical interest, and proposed the revised paragraph as a more up-to-date and succinct statement of the Department's academic aims and offerings.

Page 219: The sentence concerning 200 ~~division~~ courses has been inserted at this point to provide academic guidance for students.

These two references to SA 498 have been deleted since the course itself has been deleted due to the fact that student demand was insufficient to render it operable.

Addition of "either" is grammatical.

Page 220: The word "normally" has been inserted because it is possible for students from outside the Department to take these courses with special permission of the Department and the instructor concerned.

Reference to SA 498 deleted (see above).

Course Groupings - This sentence has been revised, since the chart to which it referred has been deleted.

Reference to lower division requirements has been deleted, since this is rendered redundant by earlier insertion (page 219).

Page 221: This chart has been deleted in its entirety because it is no longer an accurate depiction of departmental prerequisites.

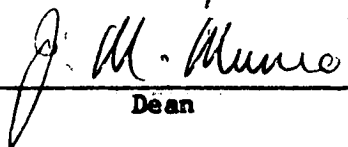

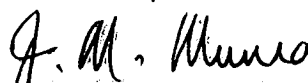

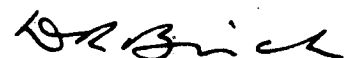
