Change of Title

From: "Introduction to Anthropology"

To: "The Ethnography of British Columbia"

ADD: Pre-requisites: This course is taught as part of the B.C. Studies Diploma Program.

Rationale: To clarify the subject matter and to avoid confusion with proposed title change of SA 170-4.

S.A. 170-4

Change of Title and Description

From: Introduction to World Ethnography

An examination of the major varieties of cultural forms studied by anthropologists. The course is designed to provide students with basic information which may be developed in subsequent courses in anthropology.

To: Introductory Anthropology

An introduction to the study of human behavior from an anthropological perspective. The course will explore the scope and nature of the discipline of anthropology through an examination of selected cultures and societies.

Rationale:

The title changed in conformity with the change of course description.

Course description was changed to give more accurate information regarding the course content.

Change of Title

From: "Race Relation"

To: "Comparative Ethnic Relations"

Rationale: Course title is changed to provide a more accurate depiction of the content of the course.

ADD: All anthropology majors should note that S.A. 370 is a prerequisite for all upper division anthropology courses. (This does not apply to students enrolled in upper division anthropology courses prior to 79-3.

The prerequisites for all upper division anthropology courses have been changed and S.A. 370-4 HISTORY OF ANTHROPOLOGICAL THOUGHT, has been added. The Department views this course as an essential requisite for studying anthropology in the upper division.
