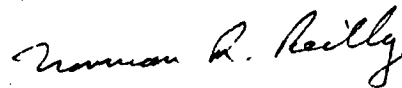
Action taken by the Senate Committee on Undergraduate Studies at its meeting on October 24 gives rise to the following motion:

Application of comparative theories and methods to selected developing nations; and

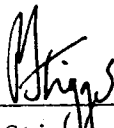
* S.A. 369-4 Political Anthropology

Comparative study of primitive and tribal political organization; leadership in non-centralized and centralized political systems.
