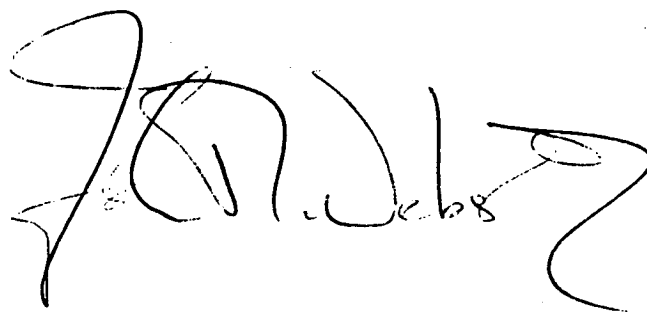

Bus. 307, p. 237 Managerial Economics

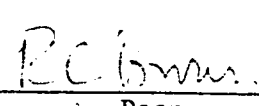
