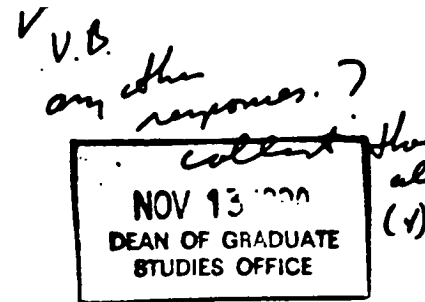

After a short discussion at the Faculty meeting, a vote was taken to see if anyone objected to the removal of the parenthetic *Criminology*. Fourteen people did not object; one person abstained. We are, it seems, ready to bid the parenthetic *Criminology* degree designation farewell.
