I'd like to stand for election to the above committee. I believe that I have the qualifications to be on this committee. I was myself once an International Graduate Student in the United States and still hold interest in the participation of international students here at SFU. I'm of the opinion that the presence of international students both at the undergraduate and graduate level locally would bring about a better level of understanding of other cultures among us. I'd like to contribute to implementing a successful policy at SFU regarding students from other countries. My own daughter is now studying at the Institute of Political Science at Grenoble, France as an exchange student and have come to appreciate the treatment she receives there from the French Government. I came to understand that the international students in France are actually eligible to receive subsidy from the Government of France. I'd like to learn more about our efforts in promoting exchange of students with other countries.
