Activity Report**1. The International Undergraduate Student Exchange Committee (IUSEC)**

The International Undergraduate Student Exchange Committee selected 77 students for participation in exchange programs outside Canada during 1996 (Cf. Appendix I for exchange partners). The current IUSEC membership includes W. Cleveland (Chair, replacing C. Reed), R. Davison, R. Sitter, V. Dahl, P. Cellik, R. Heath (ex-officio), and R. Martin (Secretary, non-voting). The membership of H. Pabel, P. McFetridge and J. Zaslove expired during the year.

SCIA supported the recommendation from the International Undergraduate Student Exchange Committee (IUSEC) to seek Board of Governors' approval for a \$100.00 Exchange Participation Fee.

SCIA asked the International Undergraduate Student Exchange Committee (IUSEC) to consider how a commentary on fraternization between students and their supervisors might be incorporated into a Field School Participant Handbook. SCIA also accepted the draft Field School Evaluation Form prepared by IUSEC's Secretary.

2. Mexico Field School Proposal

A proposal from the Faculty of Business Administration to conduct a Field School in Mexico was passed unanimously.

3. University/Industry Technology Transfer Project: Chile

The Chile project, previously recommended by SCIA for submission to the CIDA University Partnerships in Cooperation and Development Tier II funding program, was re-submitted to the CIDA Southern Cone Program.

4. PhileoAllied Berhad

SCIA was briefed on discussions between SFU and PhileoAllied Berhad, a Malaysian private sector company investigating the possibility of establishing an SFU campus in Malaysia.

5. Society, Economy and Environment Project: China

SCIA reviewed and unanimously recommended the "Society, Economy and Environment Project" brought forward by the David Lam Centre for International Communication.

6. Eastern Indonesia University Development Project (EIUDP)

SCIA was informed that J. Munro had been appointed as the new Education for Sustainable Development (ESD) Coordinator in keeping with the guidelines Senate gave the Eastern Indonesia University Development Project at the end of the Project's first phase.

7. "Common Journeys: Women Walking Together" Project

SCIA reviewed and recommended a development project submitted by the Continuing Studies Extension Program involving impoverished women in Mexico and in Vancouver's Eastside immigrant community. One negative vote was cast.

8. Briefing For New SCIA Members

Detailed briefing materials and follow up discussions were held with new SCIA members.

9. SFU/Colciencias Bilateral Cooperation Agreement: Colombia

SCIA reviewed and unanimously recommended an "umbrella" agreement with Colciencias in Colombia brought forward by the Centre for Policy Research on Science and Technology (CPROST).

10. Thailand Education Project Proposal

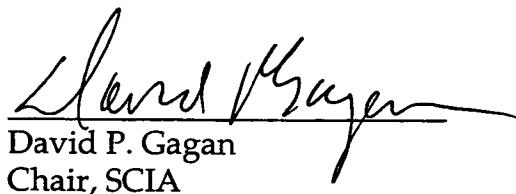

SCIA was briefed on the state of negotiations with CIDA over a possible second phase for the CCICEDP.
