The Board considers cases wherein a student or former student feels aggrieved by the decision of a faculty, department or other administrative unit relating to a registration in courses, withdrawal from the University, eligibility for graduation, approval to a program or matter relating to academic standing, when special circumstances are present.

SAB meets bi-monthly, or when there is sufficient business to warrant a meeting. The Senate Appeals Board met five times in 2002 reviewing a total 24 appeal cases, of which three were still pending by the end of the year.

## Procedure:

Each appeal is first screened to determine whether special circumstances are present. All appeals are first heard in-camera (written form only) and some are resolved at that stage. If the SAB is unable to give a positive judgement at Stage 1, and if the student has requested an in-person hearing, the case is decided at a hearing at which the student or a representative is able to present further evidence and answer questions (Stage 2). Most hearings last about 20 - 30 minutes.

The undergraduate's request for a retroactive withdrawal from the 2000-3 semester was denied by the Faculty of Arts. The request was supported by all four faculty members and the Chair. The student was unable to write final examinations due to psychological distress. The student sought help through Counselling services at SFU and received encouragement from her instructors to continue with course work.	The undergraduate's request to a selective withdrawal from BUS 254, 2002-2 prior to end of week 12 was denied by the Faculty of Business Administration. Student was unable to complete course work due to full-time work schedule and family's move to Toronto. Appeal was moved to Stage 1. The undergraduate's request for retroactive withdrawal all courses (BUS 272, BUS 251, BUS 207), 2002-1. The appeal is based on a death in the family and had to leave the country for the funeral March 24 <sup>th</sup> , returning April 22 <sup>nd</sup> . There was no evidence that the student attempted to contact the professors regarding this absence and/or make arrangements to write the final exams.	The undergraduate's request for permission to selectively withdraw from PSYC 201, 2002-2 was approved by the professor but denied by the Chair of the Psychology Department. Appeal was based on a stressful situation with girlfriend and notes being destroyed. The Board concurred with the Chair who did not feel the circumstances presented justified a selective withdrawal.	Appeal was cancelled at the May 17, 2002 SAB meeting. Additional information was received August 8th, 2002. Further details regarding allegations against an instructor in the Department of Chemistry was needed.
