Terms of Reference

March 20, 2007

The B.C. Leadership Chair In Cognitive Neuroscience in Child Health and Development is endowed by an anonymous donor to Simon Fraser University and by the Province of British Columbia through the Leading Edge Endowment Fund (LEEF). The Chair will be responsible for providing leadership to establish a world centre in which researchers will work to develop predictive indices, educational, therapeutic, and intervention strategies designed to maximize each individual child's development. In this way, the Chair will lead the creation of a centre of excellence that will benefit B.C.'s children and enable them to achieve their maximal potential for well-being and participation in all aspects of our society.

The Chair will be an internationally renowned researcher with expertise in the study of brain and behaviour in relation to developmental disabilities in children. This appointment is expected to be located in the Department of Psychology.
