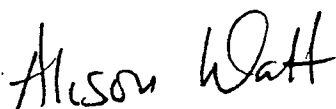

Subject: Senate Committee Elections

Under Senate regulations, any Senator who wishes to submit nominations may do so by notifying the Secretary of Senate in writing (email [watt@sfu.ca](mailto:watt@sfu.ca)) of such nominations. Nominations must be received by the Secretary no later than Friday, April 3, 2009. Nominations received after that time will not be accepted. Senators making nominations must ensure in advance that the nominee is willing to stand for election.
