The Board considers student cases wherein a student or former student feels aggrieved by the decision of a faculty, department or other administrative unit relating to:

- registration in courses
- withdrawal from the University
- eligibility for graduation
- approval of entry/re-entry to a program or
- a matter relating to academic standing when special circumstances are present

SAB meets monthly or when there is sufficient business to warrant a meeting. The Senate Appeals Board met 10 times in 2011 reviewing a total of 59 appeal cases.

Procedure:

Each appeal is first screened to determine whether special circumstances are present. All appeals are first heard in-camera (written form only) and some are resolved at that stage. If the SAB is unable to give a positive judgment at Stage 1, and if the student has requested an in-person hearing, the case is decided at a hearing at which the student or a representative is able to present further evidence and answer questions (Stage 2). Most hearings last about 20 – 30 minutes.
