Deals with the techniques for reconstruction of past environments, as well as the effect of environment on past settlements and people. Environment as considered in the course will encompass the presence of other settlements, and deal with relationships among settlements.

DESCRIPTION

TO:

Examines methods, theories, and concepts for understanding how past cultures interacted with their bio-physical surroundings. Integrates diverse kinds of data and knowledge to understand these relationships. Topics to be addressed include local and traditional ecological knowledge, paleoenvironmental reconstruction, human-environment interaction, human-induced environmental changes, paleodiet, and domestication.

PREREQUISITE

ARCH 201; or any two of ARCH 100, REM 100, GEOG 100, EVSC 100; and 45 credits

LEARNING OUTCOMES

Students will develop:

- 1) an understanding of the many ways in which traditional (subsistence-based, non-industrial) peoples interacted with their bio-physical surrounding;
- 2) an understanding of the techniques and kinds of knowledge that are used to make inferences about these interactions; and
- 3) the ability to critically evaluate the literature about past human-environmental relationships.

To make ARCH 365 more accessible to FENV students.
